



“Crazy” in Christ

“In 1818, Ignaz Philip Semmelweis was born into a world of dying women. The finest hospitals lost one out of six mothers to the scourge of ‘childbed fever.’

A doctor’s daily routine began in the dissecting room where he performed autopsies. From there he made his way to the hospital to examine expectant mothers without ever pausing to wash his hands. Dr. Semmelweis was the first man in history to associate such examinations with the resultant infection and death. After eleven years and the delivery of 8,537 babies, Dr. Semmelweis lost only 184 mothers. He spent much of his life lecturing and debating with his colleagues. Once he argued, ‘Puerperal fever is caused by decomposed material, conveyed to a wound... I have shown how it can be prevented. I have proved all that I have said. But while we talk, talk, talk, gentlemen, women are dying. I am not asking anything world shaking. I am asking you only to wash... wash your hands.’ But virtually no one believed him. Doctors and midwives had been delivering babies for thousands of years without washing, and no outspoken Hungarian was going to change them now!” (ministry127.com/resources/illustration/wash-your-hands-after-dealing-with-death)

Perhaps due to pride, a solution that was so simple, seemed unreasonable, thus, people rejected his discovery. It was not until after Semmelweis died that his discovery became accepted by the majority in the medical community of the benefit in washing hands.

Sometimes, in spite of rejecting the gospel, people still respect Christians (Acts 5:12). However, others despise us and slander our names (1 Peter 4:1-4). There are even some who view us as crazy for our beliefs and way of life. Paul said in 2 Corinthians 5:13, “For if we are beside ourselves, it is for God; if we are in our right mind, it is for you.” The word “beside ourselves” indicates a mental imbalance. And while Paul was not saying he was crazy, he is noting that some held such a view about him. The idea of believing that God became a man, died as a criminal, then rose from the dead, seemed unreasonable and crazy according to both Jews and gentiles. What’s true is not dependent upon what a majority of people believe or what seems most “reasonable,” rather truth is found where the evidence lead us to the most logical conclusion. “For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God” (1 Corinthians 1:18).

Whether it be the practice of “church” 3 times a week, abstinence from alcohol, sex outside of marriage, the belief the earth is not millions or billions of years old, etc., are all things people in the world may perceive as crazy. Christians need to remember that we “walk by faith and not by sight” (2 Corinthians 5:7), and our purpose in life is no longer living for ourselves but for the one who for our sakes died and rose again (2 Corinthians 5:14-15).
