Ronald Reagan once said, "Freedom is never more than one generation away from extinction. We didn't pass it to our children in the bloodstream. It must be fought for, protected, and handed on for them to do the same, or one day we will spend our sunset years telling our children and our children's children what it was once like in the United States where men were free." (Ministry127.com)

In a similar way, just as the freedom of a country can rapidly fade, so it is with being faithful to God.

After the children of Israel drove out the Canaanites and settled into the promised land, the people, "served the LORD all the days of Joshua, and all the days of the elders who outlived Joshua, who had seen all the great work that the LORD had done for Israel...(10) And all that generation also were gathered to their fathers. And there arose another generation after them who did not know the LORD or the work that he had done for Israel. (11) And the people of Israel did what was evil in the sight of the LORD and served the Baals. (12) And they abandoned the LORD, the God of their fathers, who had brought them out of the land of Egypt. They went after other gods, from among the gods of the peoples who were around them, and bowed down to them. And they provoked the LORD to anger. (13) They abandoned the LORD and served the Baals and the Ashtaroth. (14) So the anger of the LORD was kindled against Israel, and he gave them over to plunderers, who plundered them. And he sold them into the hand of their surrounding enemies, so that they could no longer withstand their enemies" (Judges 2:7, 10-14).

Several observations can be made from this text:

- 1. A nation, church, family or even school is just one generation away from falling away. Modern history is filled with examples of these various institutions that once started by faithful men, eventually departed from God's Word.
- 2. The process of apostasy often starts with not knowing God. Being ignorant of God's commands as well as God's actions, they failed to see the presence and goodness of God in their lives. Likewise, a failure to see God's daily blessings often leads to being consumed with selfishness, causing conflict with others and provoking the LORD to jealousy (James 4:1-5).
- 3. When God is rejected, He is replaced by idols. For Israel, He was replaced by Baal and Asherah. Idols that were worshiped by sexual immorality and child sacrifice. Likewise today, when God is rejected, man forms his own religion (Romans 1:20-25), making idols of sexual immorality and coveting (Colossians 3:5).
- 4. God has a right to punish those who reject Him. For Israel, their punishment came from their covenant violation of Him. Yet His punishment serves more as a discipline for their own good. Even though the punishment for the nation of Israel was unique due to their covenant they had with God, the LORD still has the right to punish in any way He sees fit, temporarily or eternally.
