#### GREATER THAN SOLOMON

King Solomon is one of the most accomplished men this world has ever known. He ruled more territory than any other Israelite king (1 Kings 4:21). His intelligence and wisdom exceeded that of any man of his day (1 Kings 3:12). People from all over the world came to learn from him (1 Kings 10:1–7). He had over 700 wives and 300 concubines (1 Kings 11:3). Each year he received about 25 tons of gold (1 Kings 10:14) and was regularly given silver, gold, garments, myrrh, spices, horses, and mules (1 Kings 10:24–25). If all of Solomon's wealth and assets were calculated in today's currency, he would be the only trillionaire! He was the man most men dreamed of being, and the man most women desired to marry.

In contrast, Jesus was no earthly king or ruler (John 6:1–16; 18:36–37). He never received a formal education or degree. He never married and lived a morally pure life of celibacy (Hebrews 4:15). The only times someone prestigious or powerful came to hear Him were to argue with Him (Matthew 21-22) or to condemn Him with cowardice during His arrest and trials (Matthew 26:57 -58; Luke 23:6-12; John 18-19).

Leadership:

Elders:

By today's standards, Jesus would have been considered a traveling, homeless man. He received some support from His followers (Luke 8:1–3) and often stayed in their homes (Mark 1:29–31; Luke 10:38–42). At other times, however, He had nowhere to lay His head (Matthew 8:20). By invitation, He ate with tax collectors and sinners (Matthew 9:9-13), yet often had to go into a field and pluck heads of grain to eat (Matthew 12:1).

Jesus lived a sinless life (2 Corinthians 5:21). Solomon's sins were numerous. Solomon lived for himself. In Ecclesiastes 1:16-2:17, he describes his life of wealth, wisdom, and pleasure by using the word "I" 38 times! Almost everything Solomon did was driven by selfishness. By contrast, Jesus—though He had the power to perform miracles and the opportunity to bow down to the Devil and gain worldly glory (Matthew 4:1–10)—refused. Instead, the Son of God went about doing good and serving others (Acts 10:38; Matthew 20:28).

Solomon's life was one of regret. He spent much of his life seeking purpose and meaning. In spite of his impressive résumé, he admitted that he hated his life, "because what is done under the sun... is vanity and a striving after wind" (Ecclesiastes 2:17). Jesus, however, had no regrets. His life was filled with meaningful purpose (John 6:38).

Solomon's legacy left several generations in Jerusalem with wealth and material prosperity. Jesus' legacy gave the entire world the opportunity for salvation from sin (1 Timothy 1:15) and the promise of an eternal home with the Father (John 14:1-6).

Solomon died in need of a Savior. Jesus died to save him (John 1:29). Solomon's bones are still in the ground. Jesus' tomb is empty! Solomon was just a man. Jesus is God (John 1:1).

Both of their lives show us that the things we often think will bring lasting happiness, do not. We can gain the whole world, but if we do not have God, we have nothing.
